## **ABOUT THE TOPIC**

Please join us for an insight into the differences between clinical treatment and medico legal reporting. In exploring this topic further Dr Simon Journeaux will take us on a journey of how a treatment provider thinks and ultimately arrives at a diagnosis.

Dr Simon Journeaux will focus on the lived experiences and concerns of the injured party following an initial accident and how to access early rehabilitation and treatment to enhance your patient's quality of life.

Dr Simon Journeaux will discuss the framework and strategies around assisting your patients to get the most appropriate treatment in the early stages of a claim.

Strategies and points that will be expanded on during this presentation are:

- Getting it right the first time when issuing a medical certificate; knowing when to progress to medical imaging to ascertain the diagnosis.
- Active tips on how to write a medical certificate so no one is disadvantaged during the claims process and treatment is continued and not delayed.
  In doing this stressors are reduced.
- How treatment providers make and arrive at a diagnosis.

Dr Journeaux's intention will be to provide strategies on how to actively listen and communicate with a patient in knowing that they have engaged a lawyer while enhancing the patient experience.

Dr Journeaux will conclude by looking into common pitfalls of medical radiology and how recognising the signs can assist in making the correct diagnosis.
