How to Provide Certified Identification



We are required by law to collect from you certified identification to hold on file. We may also need this documentation for part of your disbursement funding loan, should you have chosen to go with this option. Follow the below instructions to understand how to provide us with your certified identification.

Types of identification documents

The following documents are suitable forms of identification:



If you do not have any of the above forms of ID, please contact us so that we can assist you to identify what alternative forms of ID will be acceptable.

Getting your documents certified

- STEP 1 Take the originals and copies of your identification documents to a document certifier from the following list:
- **a.** Justice of the Peace
- b. Legal Practitioner
- c. Pharmacist
- d. Medical Practitioner or nurse
- e. Accountant

f. Police Officer

- **g.** Full time teacher (school/tertiary)
- Bank / credit union / building society officer with at least 2 years continuous service
- Permanent employee of a Commonwealth, State / Territory or local government with at least 2 years continuous service
- j. Commissioner for Declarations
- k. Notary Public Officer

STEP 2 – When meeting with the qualified certifier, ask them to follow these instructions:

Instructions for the certifier

Once you (the certifier) have sighted the original identification document and the copy, and confirmed that both documents are identical, write or stamp the statement as displayed in the example below, on each page of the copy.

The copies should be certified to match this example. All details must be included.

Types of Identification Documents



We may need to use more than one piece of ID if you do not have a current form of ID that contains your full legal name, date of birth and residential address.

We need to collect a certified copy of identification documents that feature your:

- Second Se
- Date of birth
- Residential address

We may need to use more than one piece of ID if you don't have a current form of ID that contains all of the information required.

What you need to do

- Please supply one certified copy of a document from column A, or
- if you don't have access to one of the documents in column A, please supply a combination of documents from columns B and C.
